Mirboo North & District Community Recovery Working Group

A Recovery Working Group - comprising local community leaders and organisations - has been established to support and build on community led recovery efforts. The group meet regularly and will be considering recovery actions and activities, and providing recommendations to the recovery process.

Storm Related Green Waste

The end date for the Storm Related Green Waste Amnesty for Mirboo North is Tuesday 30 April.

Mirboo North's transfer station has returned to normal weekday operating hours and is open from 9.00am to 4.00pm on Saturday and Sunday.

Waste disposal fees have been reintroduced for general waste at all transfer stations.

Clean-up Support for Storm Damaged Homes

If you are without insurance (or underinsured) and your home is either damaged beyond repair or at risk of a hazardous tree falling within 30 metres of your home, you may be eligible for clean-up support. To see if support is available to you, please visit:

Demolition of Storm Damaged Homes

If your home was damaged beyond repair by the by the February 2024 Victorian storms and it is not covered by insurance, we can demolish it for free. This means that you can focus your efforts and resources on rebuilding.

Emergency Recovery Victoria

Members of Emergency Recovery Victoria's private property clean up team will be in Mirboo North from 11.00am to 4.00pm on Wednesday 17 April and 10.00am to 3.00pm on Thursday 18 of April. They will be at Mirboo North Recovery Centre and can talk to you about clean up on private properties and help you to register if you are eligible.

The team will also be able to help you to register for recovery support. Once you have registered, recovery support will call you and can help you find out about: applying for payments and get financial help, finding services to support your recovery, progressing an insurance claim, accessing mental health or wellbeing services, tips to help you or your family cope with stress, getting legal support and getting support for your business.

This payment is for people who were not eligible for the Prolonged Power Outage Payment and without power for more than 72 hours due to the severe weather events between Tuesday 13 February and Thursday 22 February 2024.
